Student Protection / Safety Policy

This policy is designed to insure safety and respect for all who attend summer youth camp, on and off the campus of the Timber Bay Camp and Retreat Center. Our vision is to:

1. Introduce Christ to those who don't know Him
2. To make disciple makers of those who do

Therefore, we want to provide a safe and healthy environment, which promotes interaction with each other, growth in character and an attitude of service. We think the following expectations will serve as a means to help accomplish our vision. The bottom line is that we desire changed lives for Jesus Christ.

Expectations of Youth:

1. Treat youth leaders and other youth with respect.
2. Treat camp property and other's property/belongings with respect.
3. Remain in areas of camp buildings and camp grounds designated as "open" to youth.
4. Refrain from inappropriate touch or gestures toward others.
5. Active participation in group activities and programs.
6. Do not bring tobacco products, alcohol, or other drugs on camp property or in vehicles/on bus
7. Represent your youth group by displaying Christian values and behaviors.
8. All cell phones will be collected during registration at camp and returned before departure.

Examples of Behaviors considered Disrespectful:

1. Talking during singing, worship, teaching or when others are speaking.
2. Refusing to follow directions of youth leaders when asked.
3. Refusal to participate in games or other structured activities.
4. Being outside of the designated building while a youth group meeting is in progress, unless supervised.
5. Public display of affection or making sexual advances towards another.
6. Inappropriate physical contact such as roughhousing, wrestling, or fighting.
7. Use of electronic devices during times when they are not allowed.

Consequences for Disrespectful Behavior:

1. Students will be taken aside and talked to regarding their behavior.
2. If disrespectful behavior continues, student will sit out on activities.
3. If disrespectful behavior continues or escalates, parents will be contacted to come pick up their teen at the parents expense. Youth will be expected to explain to their parents why they were called.
4. If students choose to leave the camp premises, their parents will be contacted immediately by phone.

What teens/parents can expect from Youth Leaders:

1. We will strive to continue to grow in our walk with Christ and provide a safe, non-threatening environment.
2. Camp Directors will have cell phones if students need to contact parents.
3. To be fair, firm, consistent and loving in the enforcement of this policy, realizing that not all disruptive actions are willful disobedience, but could be the result of some inner conflict. We are here to help. We will do our best to discern between the two.
4. Any time a student needs to be taken from the room, he/she will be accompanied by two adult leaders.

CAMP FAQ's

WHAT TO BRING

- Bible and Pen (*you will need these daily*)
- Sleeping bag and Pillow
- Clothes (modest clothing, enough for 5 full days)
(We reserve the right to have you change)
- Sweatshirt(s)/Jacket
- Swimsuit, Beach Towel, Sunscreen
 - Girls swimsuits: one-piece, touching tankini or swimsuit plus cover-up
 - Guys: no Speedo's
- Sandals and Shoes
- Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Deodorant, Body Soap, Shampoo, Bath Towel, & Wash Cloth
- Laundry Bag for dirty clothes
- Flashlight
- Bug Spray

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Cell Phones
- Electronic Games
- Radios, CD players, mp3 players, iPods
- Portable DVD players, Laptop Computers
- Over the counter medications
- Prank or Gag materials or Water guns
- Knives of any kind, Firearms, Fireworks, Tobacco, e-cigarettes, Vaping Devices, Matches, Lighters, Drugs or Alcohol

What is the spiritual climate like at camp?

Great question! We will certainly have a good time, lots of laughs, and incredible memories, but all of this is for the purpose of building a spiritual environment where teens can experience what life in the kingdom of God is all about, what life as a follower of Jesus looks like, and how true wisdom and heavenly knowledge effects a person. Chapel services, silence, group interaction, and many other venues are used to facilitate a spiritual movement of the heart.

What if my child has food allergies?

Please contact camp directors if your child has special dietary needs or food allergies. Special foods may be sent only if medically necessary.

What are the sleeping accommodations like?

Clean, comfortable bunks in cabins of the same gender.

How do I get my teenager to camp?

Because this camp is organized through local Wesleyan churches, typically students arrive as part of a group from a Wesleyan church. So, if you got this information from a local Wesleyan church, then please contact them to arrange for transportation to and from camp. While we highly encourage students to arrive with their local Wesleyan church (speeds up check-in process), it is okay to bring your son or daughter to camp yourself.

Are there adequate adults and supervision?

Yes. Recognizing that we are supervising "precious cargo", we take great care to provide superior supervision and safety. Each cabin has at least one counselor, if not two. There are also kitchen staff, directors, lifeguards, and various assistants providing guidance, direction, and safety.

Can I come and visit my teenager at camp? Yes. Please let the Camp Director know in advance to make arrangements.

Can I call/contact my child at camp? You may call in case of emergency (320) 532-3200. Other incoming calls are discouraged out of consideration for other campers and planned activities. *We strongly encourage writing letters and sending to the camp ahead of time so that your teenager will receive them during his or her week at camp. How do you manage the hormonal energy of teenage boys and girls all week? Great question. Boys and girls are NOT EVER allowed to be in each other's cabins. In addition, PDA is not allowed. Friendships are encouraged among the young men and young women, but not relationships.

How does this camp deal with discipline? 1st time: warning; 2nd time: miss activity; 3rd time: sent to Camp Director. Continued disobedience may result in dismissal from camp. Campers possessing weapons, alcoholic beverages, or illegal drugs will be dismissed from camp immediately at parental expense. Campers who are exceedingly disruptive, destructive or a danger to themselves or others will be sent home at parental expense.

I don't go to a Wesleyan church, can my son or daughter still go to this camp? Absolutely! The local Wesleyan churches recognize the need to organize and implement a spiritual camp retreat where teenagers have fun while learning what it means to walk in the footsteps of Jesus. We welcome any and all teenagers to experience this wonderful week.

What if my teenager has any special needs?

If your teenager has any special, individual needs, please let us know before he or she arrives. If necessary, tell us about diet, family situations, etc. All information is kept private; only the staff involved will be told. Pertinent information can be shared on the "CAMPER Registration Form", or by emailing the camp director.

What if my teenager requires consistent prescription medication?

We have a licensed Camp Nurse on duty 24 hours a day. This nurse is the only permitted person to administer medication and perform medical services. All prescription medications need to be packaged and labeled in this manner: 1) Place medication (in its original container/packaging) in a zip lock bag. Enclose instructions on how and when to administer. If this is prescription medication, make sure directions from the doctor are enclosed and printed on the container. 2) Be sure to indicate proper storage of the medication (i.e. refrigeration) and whether the medication is "as needed" or "daily". 3) Only send enough medication for the length of camp. 4) For multiple medications: Enclose each medication in a separate zip lock bag. Medications need to be turned in to the Camp Nurse at the BEGINNING of camp, during the registration process. For camp safety reasons, students are not allowed to administer their own medication.

Do you supply pain reliever or other over-the-counter medication if needed?

Yes, over-the-counter medications can be given if deemed necessary by the camp nurse, unless otherwise noted on "CAMPER Registration Form".

What about money for traveling to/from camp?

In order to help students focus on the intention of the week and to protect their valuables, (purses/wallets/credit cards/cell phones, etc.), we offer secure storage during registration for these items.
